Bible Passages on Healing for Children



He [Jesus] was despised and rejected — a man of sorrows, acquainted with deepest grief. It was our weaknesses he carried; it was our sorrows that weighed him down. He was pierced for our rebellion, crushed for our sins. He was beaten so we could be whole. He was whipped so we could be healed. (Isaiah 53:3-5)

Let all that I am praise the LORD; with my whole heart, I will praise his holy name. Let all that I am praise the LORD; may I never forget the good things he does for me. He forgives all my sins and heals all my diseases. He redeems me from death and crowns me with love and tender mercies. He fills my life with good things. (Psalm 103:1-4)

No, despite all these things, overwhelming victory is ours through Christ, who loved us. Nothing can ever separate us from God's love. Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither our fears for today nor our worries about tomorrow—not even the powers of hell can separate us from God's love.

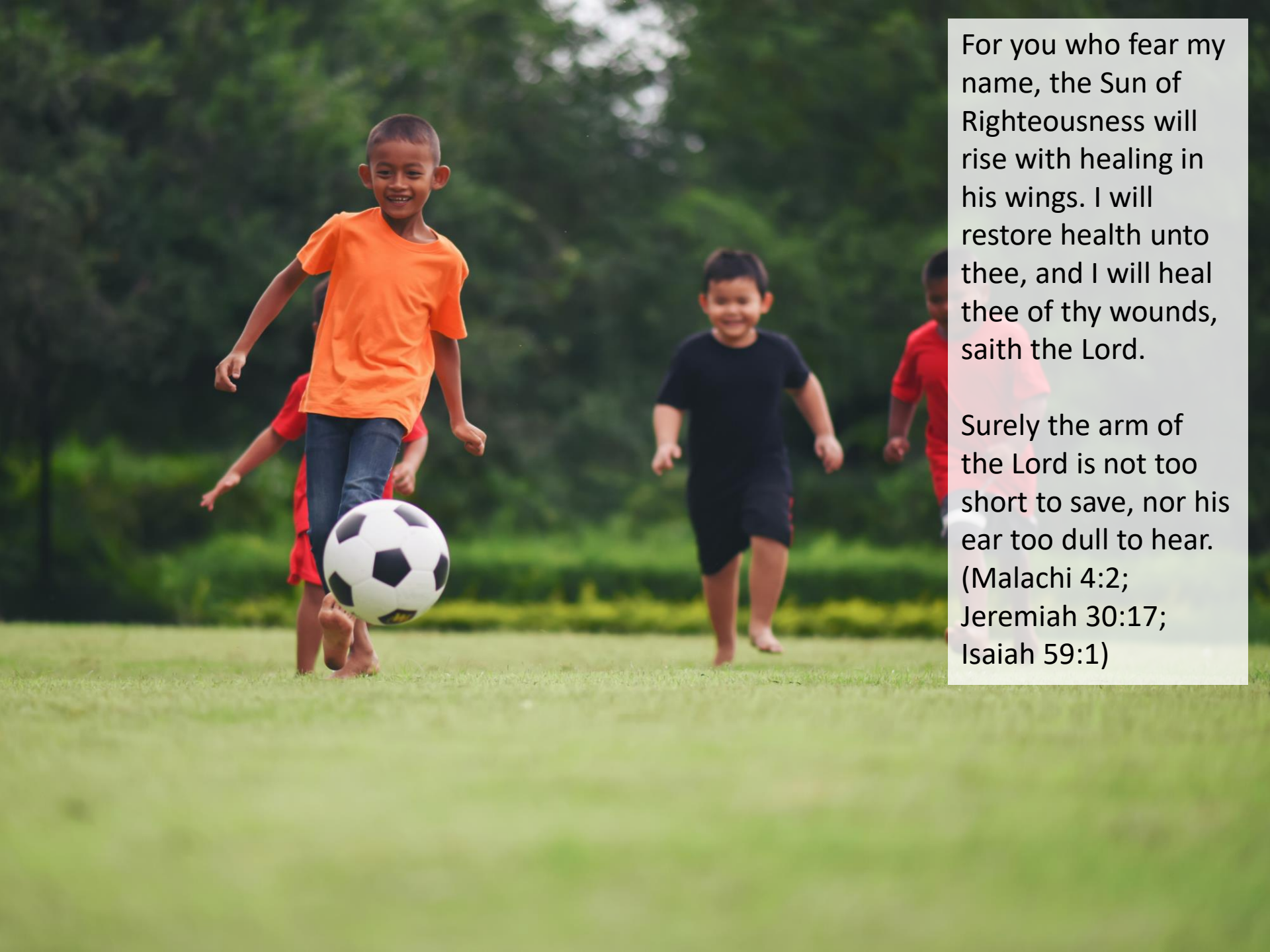
Many are the afflictions of the righteous: but the LORD delivers him out of them all.
